8. Enjoy and take part in all school activities.

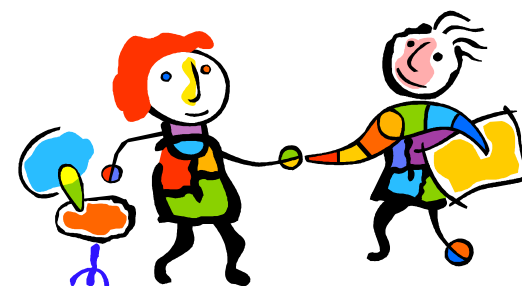
