

Sport Premium Overview

Keresforth Primary School

At Keresforth Primary School we believe PE & Sport plays an important role in making our vision statement a reality for every pupil, with the potential to change young people's lives for the better.

We have welcomed the Government's announcement in June 2013 to provide additional funding for 2 years to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. We are committed to using this resource in developing high quality PE lessons, alongside greater opportunities for sporting competitions and clubs for all our young people.

Sport Premium Grant

Funding for schools will be calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11) as at the annual census in January 2014. All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil. Smaller schools will receive £500 per pupil.

What does the Sport Premium mean for my School?

'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013).

At Keresforth Primary School we have split up the funding by the three key areas for consideration; Physical Education, Healthy Active Lifestyles and Competitive Sport. We have decided to spend the Sport Premium Grant on the following:

Physical Education:	
Raising standards of all our children in Physical education	
Objectives	Outcomes

Cost- £3,750 for curriculum support and CPD. Spent over the course of 2014/15 to coach provider.

Healthy Active Lifestyles:

Ensuring all our children have access to regular exercise

Cost £300 for SMSA training- February 2015

£500 for equipment - July 2014

£1,260 for sports coach- Paid over the course of 2014/15

Competitive School Sport: Increasing pupils' participation in extra- curricular sport	
Objectives	Outcomes
To increase the amount of competitive sport opportunities for pupils	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A school competition calendar developed with the School Games Organiser - All children in Key Stage 1 and 2 have the opportunity to participate in a competitive sport. - A range of high quality resources support the children's participation.

Costs- £1000 for equipment – July 2014

Funding for transport to and from the venues paid for by Sports funding. 2 visits in October/November 2015, 2 visits in February/March 2015.
